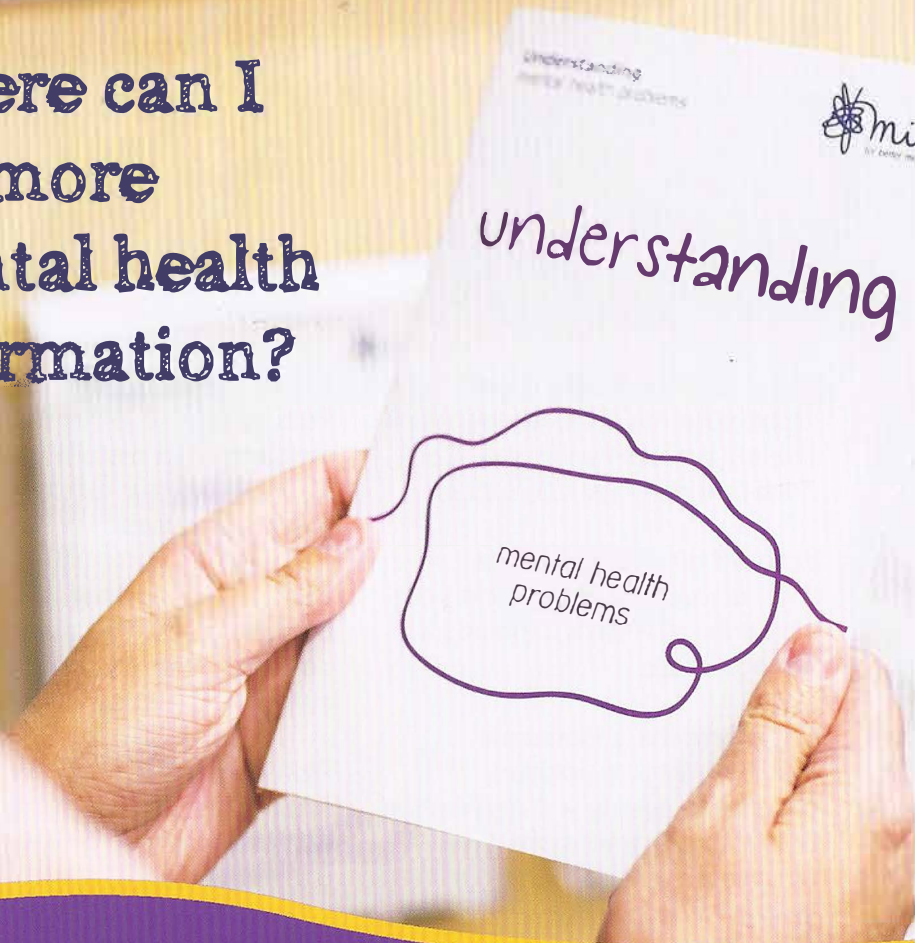

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# Quick tips on physical activity



## Short of time?

Concentrating on playing a team sport or competitive game, such as football or tennis, can help turn your focus away from your worries. And it might not even feel like exercise.

Celebrate any progress you make, however small.
